EXPLANATORY NOTE

The training discipline «International Economic Integration» is one of the training disciplines of the state component and is part of the module «International Competition and Management». It studies the essence, signs, types, stages, theories, as well as trends, consequences, and features of the development of international economic integration between countries of different levels of development and in different regions of the world.

The purpose of teaching the training discipline is the formation of students' theoretical and practical knowledge about the essence, theoretical foundations, types and stages, trends, consequences, and features of the development of international economic integration between countries of different levels of development and different regions of the world.

The tasks of studying the training discipline:

- study of the essence, features, classification of types and stages of international economic integration, economic and political theories that explain the development of international economic integration, the formation of skills and abilities to analyze trends in the development of international economic integration in the context of globalization;

- study of the consequences (effects) of international economic integration, the formation of skills and abilities to assess and monitor international economic integration;

- study of current trends and features of international economic integration between countries of different levels of development in Europe, Asia-Pacific region, North and Latin America, Caribbean region, Commonwealth of Independent States, Africa and Western Asia, the formation of skills and abilities to analyze them.

As a result of studying the training discipline, students should:

know:

- different approaches to the definition and classification of types and stages of international economic integration;

- history and current trends in the development of international economic integration;

- economic and political theories of international economic integration;

- static and dynamic, economic and political, positive and negative consequences of international economic integration;

- basic approaches to assessing and monitoring international economic integration;

- current trends in the development of international economic integration of countries of different levels of development in different regions of the world.

be able to:

- analyze current trends in the development of international economic integration and its features in various regions of the world;

evaluate and monitor the consequences and the achieved level of development of international economic integration, justify the expediency of creating international integration associations;

use the advantages of international economic integration for the development of foreign economic activity of the enterprise and the national economy;

have:

skills in assessing and monitoring the consequences and the level of development of international economic integration achieved;

skills in preparing, concluding, and executing a trade and economic transaction, considering the norms of integration agreements and national legislation.

Connection with other training disciplines: the training discipline «International Economic Integration» is based on the study of the training disciplines «Economic Theory», «Microeconomics», «Macroeconomics», «World Economy», «National Economy of Belarus» and is the basis for studying the training disciplines of the component of the establishment of higher education.

In accordance with the standard training plan of an establishment of higher education in the specialty 1-25 01 03 «World Economy», the training syllabus is designed for 120 hours, of which:

- 68 auditory hours for full-time form of education; distribution by types of auditory activities: lectures - 34 hours; seminars - 34 hours;

- 14 auditory hours for part-time form of education, integrated with educational programs of secondary specialized education; distribution by types of auditory activities: lectures - 8 hours; seminars - 6 hours;

- 16 auditory hours for part-time form of education; distribution by types of classroom activities: lectures - 8 hours; seminars - 8 hours.

The form of higher education is full-time, part-time.

The form of control is computer testing (for part-time form of education), exam.

History and current trends in the development of international economic integration. Number and structure of international integration agreements.

Theories of international economic integration. Neoclassical integration theory and the concept of a customs union. Market-institutional and dirigiste approaches. Criticism of the theory of the customs union. Free trade area models. Theoretical foundations of the common market. The theory of optimal currency areas. The evolution of political theories of integration. Theories of integration of developing countries. Soviet (Russian) school of integration. Development of the theory of integration in modern conditions.

Effects of international economic integration: static and dynamic, socio-economic and political-legal, positive and negative.

Assessment and monitoring of international economic integration.

Background, evolution, features and geographical structure of international economic integration with the participation of European countries.

European Union (EU): prerequisites and evolution of integration, conditions for entry and exit from the EU, the mechanism of the EU functioning, features, and problems of integration. Institutions and decision-making in the EU.

INFORMATION AND METODIC PART

Methodological recommendations on organization of independent work

In mastering the knowledge of an training discipline, an important stage is the independent work of students. The recommended time budget for self-study is an average of two hours per two-hour classroom session.

The main areas of independent work of students are:

- initial acquaintance with the program of the training discipline;
- familiarization with the list of recommended literature, its study and selection of additional literature;
 - work with the political map of the world, maps of integration associations, drawings, diagrams and tables;
 - study of materials from various databases of international economic organizations on integration agreements and official websites of integration associations, ministries of foreign affairs of individual countries;
 - studying and expanding the material of lectures provided by the teacher, at the expense of information from additional literature, consultations;
 - preparation for seminars according to specially developed plans with the study of basic and additional literature;
 - preparation for the main forms of control (control survey, test, intermediate control of knowledge, etc.);
 - preparation of computer presentations on certain issues of the training discipline;
- exam preparation.

Recommended Diagnostic Tools

1) Oral form: interviews, reports at seminars and conferences, oral tests and exams, assessment based on business games, action tests.

2) Written form: tests, quizzes, tests, essays, abstracts, term papers, research reports, publications of articles, reports, written tests and exams, assessment based on a module-rating system, case method or business games.

3) Oral-written form: reports on classroom and home practical exercises with their oral defense, term papers with their oral defense, tests, exams, assessment based on a module-rating system and a business game.
